

CITY OF OZAWKIE
MINUTES OF REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
April 14, 1997
Ozawkie Township Building

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Happer at 7:05 P.M.
Members present: Bostwick, Holliday, Schuenight and J. Smith.

Agenda Item #2 - Approval of Meeting Agenda

Motion by Schuenight, seconded by Bostwick, to approve the Meeting Agenda. Motion Carried.

Agenda Item #3 - Approval of Consent Agenda

Motion by Schuenight, seconded by J. Smith, to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of 3/10/97 Regular Meeting Minutes, 3/31/97 Treasurer's Report and April Warrant Register totaling \$9546.48. Motion Carried.

Agenda Item #4 - Reports

Mayor Happer noted that the recent Community Planning Survey results prepared by the K.U. Planning Team reveal information which also may be helpful to the Governing Body in prioritizing City needs. Survey results will be available at the City Office following assessment of the information by P & Z.

Mayor Happer noted that part-time employees such as the Meter Reader and City Marshall are not required to attend the monthly meetings unless requested, noting that some are paid hourly and there is no intention of paying employees to attend meetings unless specifically requested or required by law.

Utility Commissioner Schuenight reported that East sewer main South of Lift Station #1 surcharged on April 11, following rain in excess of 4". He also noted that the video inspection has been completed, and that Kramer Engineering were on site during the surcharge to evaluate flows. Jack Kramer is expected to report on the investigation to date at the May 12, 1997 Regular Meeting.

The Telemetry Controls at the Water Tower were replaced due to damage caused by flooding of the tower base. The flooding was caused by gasket failure on the inspection hatch following the recent tower maintenance. The \$2700.00 Invoice for the repair has been sent to Midwest Tank for reimbursement by them or their insurance company.

Park Commissioner Bostwick reported that the tree will soon be purchased with the money donated by the Ozawkie Fire Auxiliary. A Porta-Potty will be delivered to the Park by May 1. He also reported that he is in the process of ordering the Sand Digger Toy and a Sand Box Border for the playground. It is his intent to organize a work day to install the new equipment upon delivery. Following an inquiry by Councilman Smith regarding the condition and potential use of the tennis courts, Bostwick noted that the isolation of the area and lack of lighting are possible concerns to be addressed prior to any refurbishing of the area. His preference would be to consider relocating the facility on the park grounds only if substantial interest would justify the expense.

In the absence of Street Commissioner Rivera, G. Smith reported that the contracts for the 1997 contract street work have been executed and returned to Andrews Asphalt as follows:

On behalf of the residents and Governing Body, John Smith commended outgoing Mayor Happer and Councilman Holliday for their active participation and service to the community.

There being no further business before Council, Motion by Holliday, seconded by J. Smith, to adjourn. Motion Carried with the meeting adjourning at 7:30 P.M.
